One little boy said this reminds me of how they pray at my grandma's church, which I assume was Pentecostal because the little boy put his head down, his hands up behind him and started running. It was not unfamiliar to the rest of the kids because they all joined in cackling and enjoying the moment of sharing their traditions with me. They said come on Mrs. Courtney! Dance with us! Our faith in Jesus was deepened, our connection to each other was strengthened, and each other's trust was gained.

One of my favorite moments of all was the Love Feast 2 years ago. We had hundreds of cookies. The Spark kids showed up. As they crammed cookies the kids said, "this kind of church service is my favorite!" I would be surprised if they did not have a bellyache from the number of cookies they ate. We finished the service holding hands in a circle around the sanctuary singing Joy to the world. It was a diverse representation of the body of Christ that made me hopeful in the possibility of the reign of Christ.

There was another night where Jazzy said, "Mrs. Courtney, can the church be open all the time? This is my second home." Another kid said thank you to this church for loving us and making sure we are fed.

A teenage boy was kicked out of his house. He came to church at 10 am. He said I have been looking forward to Sunday because I knew I had a safe place to come and play basketball and a meal when I'm really hungry. Our Sunday evenings were filled with worship, singing, drawing closer to one another and closer to God, seeking wisdom in God's word, and of course a little chaos. We reenacted the Last Supper and washed one another's hands, we made slime and talked about the ickiness of sin, we made our own bread and grape juice and talked about how Jesus gave his body. We dance, we laughed, we loved, and most importantly we opened our church to a group that desperately needed it.

Thank you so much to Laurie who was there every week. She knows the kids from school and lovingly offers feedback to the kids to make them better. She pours her heart and soul into the Spark ministry and is one of the main reasons the kids see our church as their second home.

Thank you also to Theresa who has provided meals once or twice a month. She always makes double so the kids have tons of leftovers. Her mac and cheese is famous!

Thank you to everyone who has supported my ministry including spark meals, VBS, words of encouragement, camps, Fall Festival, Back to School Bash, Christmas events and so much more. I am so thankful to have walked alongside you all through some really beautiful and some really hard moments. I pray for Muir's Chapel as I leave. I pray especially that you lean on one another for support and next steps.

MCUMC History Corner

Here's a little something you may or may not know about our Glorious Cross, and it's base, that sit upon our Church altar.

It is the same Cross that glowed for many decades in our previous sanctuary as well, but in 1992 a base was made for the cross, see picture A, by one of our church members, Richard M. Tuttle, probably to lift it higher above the altar flowers and keep it from being hidden behind them.

What most of us did not know is that the base also serves as a small time capsule of sorts. On the back side of the base, see picture B, there is a door with a latch. When you open the door you find that the main part of the base lifts out, and the rest is a sort of wooden container that the base sits in, see picture C.

At the bottom of the wooden container there is an inscription, probably written by Mr. Tuttle himself, that reads: "Built by & Given by: Richard M. Tuttle, 9-1-1992, To the Glory of God", see picture D.

Below the inscription a small note has been added, see picture E, with these instructions; "The upper part of this stand was sealed 9-1-1992. Please do not open before the year 2000. It contains a Muir's Chapel pictorial directory, bulletins, and weekly newsletter. (To open, remove felt and screws from top of top section.)"

Mr. Tuttle and his wife Phyllis, left Muir's Chapel at some point, possibly in the late 90's. Mr. Tuttle passed away in 2022.






